During the interval, there will be a short informative address about the provenance of this unique chapel given by the Reverend Professor Peter Galloway OBE.

The Chapel belongs to Her Majesty The Queen in Her Right as Duke of Lancaster. It is a 'free' chapel or 'peculiar', not falling within any bishop's jurisdiction, but remaining within the Church of England. It is the last surviving building of a hospital founded by Henry VII for homeless people in 1512. It is a beautiful, intimate space for a concert with a fine acoustic and a splendid Walker organ.
